- Regarding national or international supply chains, our point of contact is preferably with a UK company or branch. We expect the companies we work with to have their own anti-slavery and human trafficking policies.

We have systems in place to encourage the reporting of concerns to appropriate bodies and the protection of whistle blowers.

We have a zero tolerance to slavery and human trafficking. We expect all those in our supply chain and working alongside us to comply with our values.
